Selected students will prerecord a short pitch which will be presented to a panel of judges during the webinar. Following the pitch, judges will do a live q&a session with the presenter. The students will get to participate in a focused mentoring session where they will learn how to promote themselves and their research.

The pitch should focus on an idea which could be immediately translated into a product. It could be based on research currently being done or a novel nanoscience idea the student would like to pursue. To apply, a written (max 300 words) pitch will be submitted which includes the title, product idea, targeted market, and a description of the product and how it works.
